

A message from our Chaplain, Cantor Alan Edwards:

On April 23rd we will begin the celebration of Passover, the festival that proclaims freedom and unity and identified Jews with their ancestors who ended their bondage in Egypt. It is a holiday of remembrance of the Jews who kept faith with their religion during the long, hard years of slavery. It is a holiday which exalts the freedom G-d desires for you.

Passover also contains a strong connection to the theme of creation. It is one of the four new years of the Jewish calendar. Nisan, the Jewish month in which the festival occurs, was traditionally seen as the first month of the Jewish year.

One of the best teaching tools has to be the Seder, the ceremonial meal that ushers in Passover and is held on the first two nights. There are four themes of the Seder that repeat. This is based on the verse in Exodus that states; "I am the L—d and I will <u>bring</u> you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, and I will <u>deliver</u> you from their bondage, and I will <u>redeem</u> you with an outstretched arm and with great judgments, and I will <u>take</u> you to Me for a people, and I will be to you a G-d" (Exodus 6:6-7). Among many themes of the Passover Seder is the repetition in the patterns of four. We drink four cups of wine, the youngest child recites the Ma Nishtanah (the four questions) and we speak about the four types of children.

In telling the story of the exodus from Egypt, and the plagues that preceded it, Jews also highlight G-d's role in the redemption. Moses is not mentioned in the traditional Haggadah lest too much focus center on him and his role rather than on G-d, the Sovereign of the Universe. The Haggadah stresses that it was not a messenger or angel, but G-d who redeemed the Jews. The Exodus is a formative experience for the Jewish people.

**Merrill Kelem** reminiscing about things:

One morning back in July of 1991, I walked into a famous coffee spot on the Boardwalk at which time **Tommy**, one of the owners, who is also an Atlantic City and County Official, who saw me pull up, met me at the door all nervous and in a cold sweat. He said to me "You'll never guess who I just made breakfast for". I then made a 'funny' and asked 'who', and his reply was "**Rizzo**, he's in the back eating". Well, I took **Tommy** to the back, and stopped in front of the table and said "Good morning Boss".

Well, to make a long story even longer, I formally introduced **Tommy** to **"The Man"** and for the next three hours we were just three guys exchanging stories on our careers.

I can remember what **Frank Rizzo** told me that morning and it stuck in my head ever since. He said "**Merrill**, my boy, so far you have had a very promising career. (at that time I had told him that I had 18 years on) Look at all the things you have done and all the people you have met. Why yours is almost as interesting as mine". We all laughed and I replied "not yet, boss". **Rizzo** told us, "I had a front row seat". We all agreed to that. He then told me "You too, before you end your career, will have a front row seat and you will never look back". Well, **Mr. Mayor**, you were 101% right, I did have a front row seat, and I won't look back!

Unfortunately, three weeks later Frank Rizzo passed away.

I knew this man since I was a child when he often came in **Kelem's Deli & Cafeteria** on South Street, back in the 1960's. But how true, never look back, always look on. I will never forget that morning in July, 1991 with that wonderful sit-down with **Frank Rizzo**.

Come to the meetings and I will share a story or two with you. Merrill




