

Chaplain's Corner:

“Let all who are hungry come in and eat, let all who are needy come in and make Passover” Passover Haggadah

On April 2nd we will be celebrating the festival of Passover; Pesach in Hebrew is the great spring festival that commemorates the Biblical liberation from exile and the exodus from Egypt.

For eight days, (seven for the Jews who live in Israel and for certain Jews who live in Diaspora) we eat Matzah, unleavened bread. This is in honor of the Israelites hurried exit from Egypt in which they did not have time to wait for the bread to rise. The Bible tells us of the plagues that G-d brought to down upon Pharaoh and his people in order to persuade him to let the Israelites go free.

The telling of the Exodus story is the main theme that permeates throughout the Passover Seder that is celebrated on the first two nights of Passover (or just one for some).

We use a book that narrates the story of Passover called the “Haggadah”. We fulfill the scriptural commandment to teach our children about the Jewish liberation from slavery in Egypt as described in the book of Exodus. The Haggadah also contains various rituals that involves traditional songs and stories and the use of symbolic foods. The word Seder means the “order” of the various rituals of the service. The Seder includes a festive meal. In addition to being one of the most celebrated holidays it is considered an integral aspect of the Jewish faith and identity. Unlike other public holiday observances that are traditionally held in the synagogue, the Seder is usually held in the home. Passover is undoubtedly the festival that requires the strictest ritual observance. Not only refraining from eating bread or any unleavened products for eight days, but ridding our houses beforehand of all food not suitable for eating on Passover.

Permit me to share with you a letter that was written by a Jewish Confederate soldier, Isaac J. Levy of the 46th Virginia Infantry, from Camp Adams Run, South Carolina, to his sister, describing how he and his brother Ezekiel, (Zeke) observed Passover during the Civil War.

“Dear Lenora:

We were all under the impression in camp that the first day of Pesach (Passover) was on the 22 and if my memory serves me right, I think Ma wrote me that Pesach was on the 22 inst.

Zeke (Captain Ezekiel J. Levy of the 46 VA) was somewhat astonished on arriving in Charleston on Wednesday afternoon to learn that, that was the first Seder night. He purchased Matsot sufficient to last us for a week. The cost is somewhat less than in Richmond, being but two dollars a pound. (Matzah in New York was six cents a pound).

We are observing the festival in truly Orthodox style. On the first night we had a fine vegetable soup. It was made up of a bunch of vegetables Zeke brought from Charleston containing new onions, parsley, carrots, turnips, a young cauliflower together with a pound and a half of fresh kosher beef.

Love to all, Your affectionate brother,

Isaac J. Levy”

Note: Isaac J. Levy was killed in the trenches at Petersburg, August 21, 1864. He was 21 years old. Isaac is buried in the Hebrew Cemetery on Shokoe Hill in Richmond, in the family plot.

As we sit down and celebrate this beautiful holiday of Passover, let us remember all the members of our armed forces who made the supreme sacrifice through the years and through the conflict that we are experiencing today, so that we can be with our loved ones on this beautiful festive holiday.

On behalf of my dear wife Norma and our dear children and grandchildren, we wish all our members a Passover filled with joy and happiness.

Growing Up Jewish -

If you are Jewish and grew up in a city with a large Jewish population, or are gentile with Jewish friends or associates, the following will invoke heartfelt memories - so read on. . . .

The Yiddish word for today is PULKES (PUHL-kees) Translation: Thighs. Please note: this word has been traced back to the language of one of the original Tribes of Israel, the Cellulites.

The only good advice your mother ever gave you was "Go! you might meet somebody!"

You grew up thinking it was normal for someone to shout "Are you O.K.?" through the bathroom door if you were in there more than 3 minutes.

Your family dog responded to commands in Yiddish,

Every Saturday morning your father went to the neighborhood deli for whitefish salad, whitefish 'chubs', lox, herring, corned beef, roast beef, potato salad, coleslaw, a half dozen huge barrel pickles which you reached into the brine for, a dozen assorted bagels, cream cheese and rye bread, (sliced while he waited). All of which would be strictly off-limits until Sunday morning.

Every Sunday afternoon was spent visiting your grand-parents and/or other relatives.

You experienced the phenomenon of seeing 50 people fitting into a 10 foot wide dining room hitting each other with plastic plates trying to get to a deli tray.

You thought pasta was used exclusively for kugel and kasha with bowties.

You were as tall as your grandmother by age of seven.

You were as tall as your grandfather by age of seven and a half.

You never knew anyone whose last name didn't end in one of the five standard suffixes (berg, baum, man, stein and witz).

You were surprised to discover that wine didn't always taste like cranberry sauce.

You can look gefilte fish in the eye and not turn green.

When your mother smacked you really hard, she continued to make you feel bad by hurting her hand.

You can understand Yiddish but you can't speak it.

You're still angry at your parents for not speaking both Yiddish and English when you were a baby.

You have at least one ancestor who is related somehow to your spouse's ancestor.

You thought speaking loud was normal.

You considered your Bar or Bat Mitzvah a "Get out of Hebrew School Free" card.

You think eating half a jar of dill pickles is a wholesome snack.

You're compelled to mention your grandmother's "steel cannonballs" upon seeing fluffy matzo balls served at restaurants.

You buy 3 bags of hot bagels on every trip to NYC and ship them home via FedEx.

Your mother or grandmother took personal pride whenever a Jew was noted for some accomplishment (showbiz, medicine, politics, etc.) and was shamed and embarrassed when a Jew was accused of a crime... As if they were relatives.

And, finally, you knew that Sunday night or any night after a holiday was designated for Chinese food.

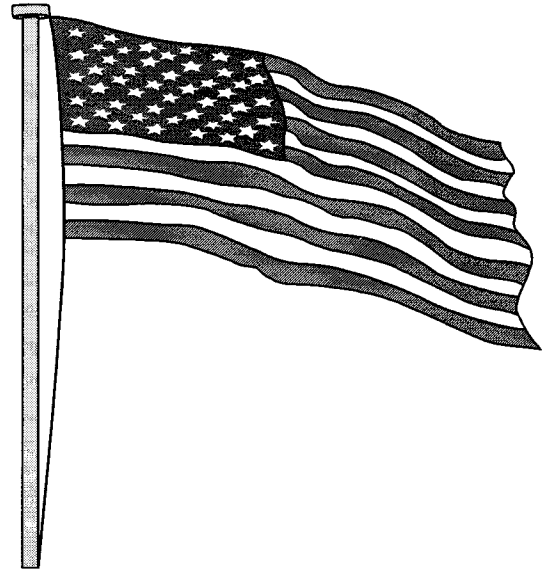
