As you may or may not know, I am now relocated to Orlando in sunny Florida. I had the movers take all my 'stuff' on Thursday, 8/12/04 and I was scheduled to fly down on Friday, 8/13/04. However, something called Hurricane Charley cancelled all flights to Orlando, so I drove down. I thought I would take a couple of days to do the drive and stay overnight somewhere along the way. Starting in North Carolina, all the way down to South Carolina, thanks to 'Charley', there was not one room to be had in any motel, hotel or flop house. So, I pulled into a rest stop and grabbed a couple hours of sleep in the van and then drove the rest of the way to Orlando, arriving Saturday afternoon.

I hope everyone is having a great summer. Mine WAS great until now! What an experience! Wow!
